



Callington Spur Trail

The Callington Spur Trail is a joint venture of South Australian Recreation Trails Inc. with the support of the Rural City of Murray Bridge. It is designed for both walkers and mountain bikes.

The Callington Spur Trail is a linear trail of 27km with head of trail signs at the Truck Drivers Memorial, Adelaide Road, Murray Bridge and at Bridge Street, Callington.

Be sure to follow the Callington Spur Trail markers and keep to the designated trail.

Commencing your journey at the Truck Drivers Memorial, travel 2km West towards Tower Hill.



From this vantage point high above Murray Bridge you have majestic views overlooking the river and town below. You are now in the Kinchina Conservation Park. Head Northward following the Jailbreak Trail for 4km to Rocky Gully, where you intersect with the Lavender Federation Trail (LFT).



At this junction you can choose to turn East and return to Murray Bridge along the LFT a distance of 7km.

Continue West on the now joint trails through Rocky Gully, a hidden treasure boasting magnificent rocky outcrops, valley views and native fauna and flora.



A unique trail experience awaits you as you approach the Monarto Safari Park, here you may catch a sight of bison, giraffe and other exotic animals.

Note: Pets are NOT permitted in this area



At the Western end of the Safari Park fence you leave the LFT and continue 6km to Callington Hill for stunning views across the Bremer Valley to Callington and beyond to the outline of Mount Barker.



Leaving the summit, travel through the Native Grassland Flora Reserve and then via a tree lined track into Callington (3km). Toilets at the town oval.
